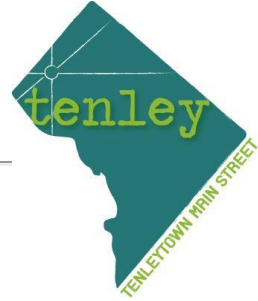

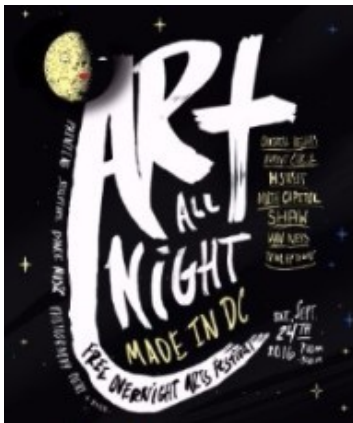
Art All Night Brings New Energy to Wisconsin Avenue

Tenleytown knows how to party. The local arts community was on full display for Art All Night: Made in DC on Saturday, September 24. More than 50 artists and performers – most from the greater Tenleytown area – participated, drawing over 5,000 visitors to Wisconsin Avenue.

From Bollywood dance to live jazz, poetry slams to play readings, yarn bombing to sculptural installations, paintings to jewelry – and everything in between – Tenleytown’s 11 venues showcased art in all its forms. Sidewalks came alive as Art All Night attendees walked among exhibit spaces and stopped in area restaurants to fuel their art adventures until midnight. “I’ve never seen Tenleytown so bustling on a Saturday night,” remarked one attendee.
