Tenleytown came alive with music, dance, street performers, artists, and thousands of art lovers of all ages during Art All Night on Saturday, September 29. Now in its third year, the diverse celebration of the visual and performing arts drew 12,800 people to our 14 arts venues.

Wisconsin Avenue was abuzz with festival goers, who came not only from the surrounding neighborhood but across the District and Maryland. Crowds filled local restaurants and shops, leading to record sales at some locations.

COME SIT A SPELL IN FESSENDEN PARK

The Friends of Fessenden Park, a committee of Tenleytown Main Street, installed new tables and chairs at the park this fall, and invite community members to come try them out. The seating is a pilot program to evaluate furniture styles the community may prefer as part of a larger design process for permanent upgrades to the park.

The furniture includes a mix of large, round dining tables and sturdy dining chairs with arms, small bistro tables with armless chairs, and Adirondack chairs. In addition to testing styles of seating, the Friends are trying out a range of colors and materials to see what resonates best.

"We hope that the new furniture will entice members of the community to use the park as a meeting spot, an outdoor lunch location, or simply as a place to relax," said Leigh Catherine Miles, Executive Director of Tenleytown Main Street. "We look forward to the community's feedback on this temporary installation as we work toward a more comprehensive redesign of the park."

Community members are encouraged to spend time in the park to test which furniture they like best. The tables and chairs are fully movable, and the Friends of Fessenden Park look forward to learning not only which seats are most comfortable, but also where park-goers prefer to sit.

The temporary furniture installation will remain in the park at least through the fall and return in the spring of 2019.

The Friends of Fessenden Park will use the feedback, along with other community input, when making recommendations for permanent furnishings at the park.

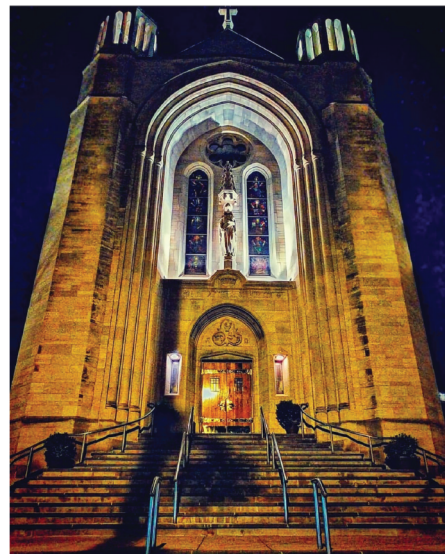
